Canadian Tire First Shift – 13 registrants to date. Greg has had several parents/grandparents inquire about purchasing them for Christmas. We can take up to 30 participants. Ryan has done some articles.

Rep Development is complete. Great feedback from coaches, parents, & players. Spike got and listened to all feedback. Greg thought the early sessions were very beneficial, compared to last season when development sessions were held later.

House league development – Greg talked to Trudy Stacey who conducted the development with the house league this weekend. She felt skating skills should be priority with this group. Greg will take her feedback and will try to develop a package for next season. He would also like to give coaches a development plan for the season, at the start of the season next year. Greg feels there need to be a bigger female presence in our association and would like to see Trudy more involved in both rep and houseleague development.

Next year:

First Shift -Do we want to do it again next year? When? Co-ed or all girls? Etc.

Development Package – Put forth a program to all coaches, at the start of the season, using Trudy, Spike, and Hockey Canada as resources.

Hockey Canada – Greg suggests running it again. He would suggest bringing their own lunch. He thinks Ryan Hurley should develop a more specific program for 3 different levels of players. The basketball component was very effective, also.

Goalie Development – Much better attendance this year. Dan Stewart ran it. There were 7-13 girls/session compared to last year when there were usually just 2.

All players must wear matching pants & helmets)." 17 of the 18 teams responded "Our association doesn't always enforce game play dress code with the senior teams. (eg. Our association sometimes allows senior players to play without everyone wearing matching pants & helmets.)" Jen made a motion that the coaching staff of the senior team strongly encourage uniform compliance, but exceptions may be made for on-ice uniform policy for WNGHA senior teams. The vote will have to be held at the next meeting due to lack of quorum. The survey results are in Appendix A.

3. Veronica –

- 1. Coach/Team Staff Feedback forms: last year we did these forms manually. Would Ryan like to add it as an on-line feature this year? I think we can get this up and running now/anytime as we're half way through the season. Action Veronica will email the coach/staff feedback form to ALL executive members for review & analysis before the final version is compiled. Once the final version is done, Ryan will post it online.
- 2. Veronica would like to approach the Lion's Centre to book a date for the year end banquet. Originally she wanted to secure the same date as last year, the Thursday before Easter weekend; however that date has been booked! Her next choice is the Sunday at the end of March Break Sunday, March 18, 2018 3pm 7pm. The following weekends are provincials, lower lakes/championship, and Easter; and then we'll be into tryouts.

During the discussion, there seemed to be concern at having the banquet before the season is over because if something good happens at Provincials &/or league championship day, we want to celebrate it at the banquet. Perhaps we could have it on a week night, following provincials. This will be discussed further at our next executive meeting.
